

Do NOT Release Student's Information to the Military

DIRECTIVE TO PROHIBIT RELEASE OF STUDENT INFORMATION TO MILITARY RECRUITERS

To student and parent/guardian:

In 2002, Congress amended the Elementary and Secondary Education/No Child Left Behind Act to require public school districts to release their lists of high school students and their contact information to military recruiters, or risk losing federal funding. However, **families have the right to prohibit the release of information** for this military purpose. **If you do not want your family member's personal information provided to military recruiters by the school district, you must notify the principal of the high school.**

Fill out the information below, make a copy of the signed document, and send the original to the student's school principal (call to learn the school's deadline to receive this form to prevent notification to military recruiters; it is usually the start of Fall Quarter).

Do NOT release any of my child's directory information, including name, address, phone number, email, **to military recruiters during any school year**. This directive exercises the right against disclosure provided for under Paragraph 2, Subsection (a) of Section 9528 of Public law 107-110 ('No Child Left Behind'), 2002.

ATTENTION REGISTRAR: A student's signature alone on this form is valid. Under Sec 9528 of the NCLB (Armed forces recruiter access to students and student recruiting information), (2) Consent it states "A secondary school student or the parent of the student may request that the student's name, address and telephone listing described in paragraph (1) not be released.

Note: This directive does not prohibit information about the above named student(s) circulating to institutions of higher learning or for employment/occupational purposes.
